

SUMMER CAMP RULES

- 1. "Love Your Neighbour As You Love Yourself." Everyone is to be treated with respect.
- 2. Follow the leader If a leader asks you to do something, please respect & trust that their decision/request is for the benefit of everyone, especially you!
- 3. Guys and Girls are not alone together. No girls in boys dorms/tents and vice versa.

- 5. You are not to swim without a leader and lifeguard on duty or leave the camping ground alone.
- 6. Stranger Danger! Do not talk to strangers at any time during camp (please report strangers on-site to a youth leader.
- 7. Attend all meetings we ALL attend every meeting as outlined in the program. Every young person and leader are to be in the session unless there is an emergency.
 - 8. NO Drugs, vaping or Alcohol- anyone found with these substances will be sent home immediately. ZERO TOLERANCE.

SECURITY & SAFETY

This year we have 3 registered nurses on site as well as a number of first aid certificate holders to ensure that your teenagers not only thrive and have fun but remain safe.

Alongside our incredible youth leaders, we have extra adult volunteers onsite doing security for us throughout the camp to maintain a safe environment for all.

Every adult on site has a working with children's check and has been verified by our HopeUC team through the NSW government system. We don't allow visitors at camp; we know everyone who comes in and out and have a record of their WWCC.

If you need to get in touch with your teenager and are unable to reach them directly, there are two ways to contact us:

- 1. Contact your Youth Pastor or your young person's Life Group Leader directly.
- 2. Use the Glenrock emergency phone number, which will be shared with families via email closer to camp.

This year, we are encouraging a phone-free camp. We understand this may feel challenging, but it provides an extra layer of safety and helps create a more focused, distraction-free environment for our young people. Please note that the camp location has little to no mobile service. However, we will have campus-based phones available to ensure open communication between parents and campers whenever necessary.
